Dear, Healthcare Leaders,

Have you ever wondered if your organization is detecting individuals at risk of human trafficking and if they are being provided with the help needed? Do your physicians, nurses and other team members feel equipped to step in to help persons at risk?

The Orange County Human Trafficking Task Force (OCHTTF) Healthcare Subcommittee invites you to come learn about the current state of Human Trafficking in Orange County on **Saturday, May 3, 2025 at 9 a.m.** and how you can help make a difference. This event is being held as part of a launch event for Cycling 4 Change as they begin their journey to cycle across the U.S. in 6 weeks to raise awareness and break the cycle of human trafficking.

Human trafficking is a pervasive issue with long-term health consequences for victims. You have an opportunity to play a crucial role that can positively impact the recognition and response of those who are being trafficked or are at risk of being trafficked. According to several studies, 68 to 88% of survivors are in contact with a healthcare professional before, during, and after exploitation. It is essential that healthcare is not only aware of this issue but provided with the educational tools needed to help in their practice to build policy, processes and improve interventions for optimal care for this patient population.

In the latest OCHTTF Human Trafficking Victim Report, in 2021 and 2022:

- 420 victims and survivors of human trafficking were assisted
- 36% of the victims assisted were minors, 64% adults
- 90% of the victims assisted were female, 10% male
- 85% of the victims assisted were U.S., 15% foreign nationals
- 479 new referrals for victim support and resources were received
- 89% of the victims were sex trafficking, 9% labor trafficking, 1% sex and labor trafficking
